Gaby dreamed of becoming a nurse. Although her life moved naturally around Spanish-speaking people, she knew deep down the language barrier would crush that dream and that the longer she waited to learn English, the harder it would be for her to succeed. It was going to be a long road, but she was confident that she would accomplish her goal. A family member introduced her to the Literacy Connection. She became a student in the English as a Second Language (ESL) program seven years ago. Her tutors took their time with her and



taught her at a comfortable level how to put her words into writing, to use proper English, and to master punctuation. Her current tutor has been with her for the past six years and has provided nearly 400 hours of instruction.

According to Gaby, "It's not enough to be part of the problem; you must be part of the solution." By advancing her education, her communication with others has improved tremendously and she is more confident. In the immediate future, she would like to take entry level exams for college courses. According to Gaby, the effects of a cultural transition could be the beginning of a better life; one that allows her to leave a legacy for her children.
