#### **Tutor Tip**



There are many benefits for reading out loud...especially for our Basic Readers and our English Language Learners. As a tutor, you can use these oral reading opportunities to determine whether or not your learner is reading correctly which would affect their comprehension. Additionally, it gives learners an opportunity to self-correct while reading. While leaners might be embarrassed by reading aloud, remind them that Abraham Lincoln was among the many famous people who read aloud.

Lincoln's longtime law partner, William Herndon, described Lincoln's study habits this way:

Mr. Lincoln's habits . . . of reading law, politics, poetry, etc. . . . were to come into the office, . . . sprawl himself out on the sofa, chairs, etc., and read aloud, much to my annoyance. I have asked him often why he did so and his invariable reply was: "I catch the idea by two senses, for when I read aloud I hear what is read and I see it; and hence two senses get it and I remember it better . . . ."

Here are some recommendations for reading out loud:

- 1. Hand out copies of the reading passage.
- 2. Model the reading.
- 3. Check for comprehension.
- 4. Read the text out loud in unison.
- 5. Have the student read out loud.
- 6. Have the student practice at home.

7. At the next tutoring session have the student read out loud again - at this point you could record the student and let them hear their progress!

Reading aloud increases engagement with the text and promotes understanding. It also helps develop speaking skills and fluency.

#### It's 311 Tip!

It's solicitor season. Look out for yourself and your neighbors. Here's what you need to know:

- 1. If you don't know who is at your door, don't feel compelled to answer.
- 2. If you do answer to unknown persons, never release your personal information OR let them into your home
- 3. All solicitors must have solicitor permits on file with the city. If you've answered and don't see the city-issued solicitor's identification tag, call Elgin Police at 847-289-2700.
- 4. If someone represents themselves as a City of Elgin employee and asks to see your bills, this should be a red flag. City of Elgin employees do not come to your house asking to to see your bills.
- 5. It is wise to review the City of Elgin's Solicitor Permit Rules and Regulations: <a href="http://bit.ly/1pD8Kgb">http://bit.ly/1pD8Kgb</a>. If your experience violates these rules, contact Elgin Police Department's non-emergency line at 847-289-2700.
