# **Tutor Tip**

"To" vs. "For"

1) When to use "to"

Use "to" when there is some kind of transfer happening or something is being moved from one place to another. "To" expresses direction.

Here are a few examples:

- \* "We went from the restaurant to the party."
- \* "Talk to your teacher and get more information about the exam."
- \* "I go to the office every morning at 9am."
- \* "He sold his car to me for \$5,000."

2) When to use "for

- 1) Use "for" when something is being done to benefit something or someone else.
- 2) Use "for" when you are trying to express purpose or the reason that something is

happening.

Here are a few examples:

- \* "I bought this gift for you."
- \* "He runs for his health."
- \* "Bring this tea upstairs for your grandmother."
- \* "Buckle up for safety."

3) Now compare both

Example 1:

"My friend brought lunch to me." (My friend physically carried the lunch and delivered it to me)

#### versus

"My friend brought lunch for me." (My friend paid for my lunch because he wanted to do something nice for me)

#### Example 2:

"I made a quick phone call to my mom." (I called with the intention of speaking with my mom)

#### versus

"I made a quick phone call for my mom." (My mom wasn't able to make the call so I made the call for her)

4) Now take a quiz!

Mary: Thanks for helping me move into my new apartment, Mike!
Mike: Oh you are welcome, it'll be much easier \_\_\_\_1\_\_you if I help.
Mary: Are any of your friends going to come and help also?
Mike: Yeah, I think Jason is going to come. He'll bring the moving van \_\_2\_\_your house on Saturday morning at 9am so we can get started.
Mary: Oh great. I want to cook some lunch \_\_3\_\_you guys. What do you like?
Mike: Why don't we just take a lunch break and head down \_\_4\_\_ my favorite Japanese restaurant? It's right next to your new apartment.
Mary: That sounds like a great way to break up the day and to get some more energy \_\_5\_\_ the rest of the afternoon.

**Mike:** Perfect! Then I will see you on Saturday around 10am. **Mary:** Great, see you then.
